I don't know about you, but on many days...too many days, that quote fits like a glove. It's one of the issues I struggle with most often: that very thin line between relying on me too much and relying on God too much.

Regarding the former, this mindset can lead to the belief that the chief task of Christian living is an endless treadmill of things to improve ourselves. We keep working and working and working in the ways we think are correct, righteous, and holy, all the while ignoring our inner voice. Ultimately, this only produces fatigue & frustration.

With the latter, understanding that God typically doesn't work that way, meaning we do little to nothing, putting everything on God. This is kind of like the story of the two kids who are late for school and the 1st kid says, "Let's sit here and pray we get to school on time." To which the 2nd kid screams back, "No way! Let's pray we get to school on time while running like the wind!"

You see, we have to do our part because with God, everything is relationship, a two way street, there's give and take. Yes, God can and does perform miracles, but this isn't his usual or typical method of help. We are. Full period. Full stop. We are! Because we are the salt and light of the world as the hands and feet of Jesus.
